Facts About Labor Day

The first celebrated Labor Day was on Tuesday, September 5, 1882 in New York City, planned by the Central Labor Union.

10,000 workers marched from City Hall all the way to 42nd Street and then met with their families in Wendell Elm Par for a picnic, concert and speeches.

Oregon was the first state to celebrate Labor Day as a legal holiday in 1887.

The decision to make Labor Day the first Monday in September was approved on June 28, 1894.

There is still a Labor Day parade in New York City, which takes place throughout the 20 blocks north of 1882 labor march.
